



**8:00 - 10:00 am: Green Crab Sampling with Emily Molden,** Resource Ecologist, Nantucket Land Council **and Dr. Emily Goldstein-Murphy,** Director of Natural Science, Maria Mitchell Association. Join Emily and Emily while they sort through a trap of crabs, identify crab species from Nantucket Harbor, and learn about their ongoing research into invasive European Green Crabs and how they may be impacting our marine ecosystems.

**10:00 – 11:30** am: Invasive Tunicate Detection and Identification with Mary Carmen, Woods Hole Oceanographic Institute and Cristina Kennedy, MA Coastal Zone Management. 
## Saturday, Sept 29th
